Foster a Child Program

Preparing children to face the world

This program provides a bright and competitive future for the children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS. We provide physical, mental, psychological, health, education improvement, social responsibility and growth. We encourage the children to be competitive and confident so that they can face any challenge. So far, we have supported 150 children.

The community plays a great role in volunteering, donating cash and in-kind services. This immensely helps them to build a bright and better community through their own initiative and contribution.

I walk with pride to school

I am Elamathy, 15 years, studying in 11th Grade. I live with my father and grandmother at Mohanoor village in Nammakkal District. My mother died three years back affected by HIV/AIDS. My father, who too is infected, struggles to work and earns very little. My father did not have money to buy me uniforms, school bag and proper note books. Eventhough, I did not have uniform and books, I still went to school. My friends made fun of me and I was hurt. My grandmother consoled me saying she is confident that someone would help me.

True to her words, staff of SSH visited my house and my grandmother shared my situation. SSH gave me uniform, school bag, note books, and other basic things. My appearance changed. Classmates who laughed at me became my friends! SSH also helped to get my tuition fee of Rs 1000 from Mr Ganapathy, a Rotarian. I together with my 150 friends, who are supported through this program, thank SSH and the Rotary Club for helping us to study and dream positively of better future.

Helping women and children with HIV/AIDS to overcome their difficulties

Improving health is the key

- 230 children continue their studies
- No school dropouts in our focus villages
- Child labour reduced to 20 percent
- Enhanced life status among 170 PLHAs
- Reduced new occurrence of HIV/AIDS
- Life span of PLHAs increased to 75 percent

I am Ganga Devi, 17 years and have completed my 12th Grade. I live with my positive mother and an affected sister. My father died a few years back with HIV/AIDS. My mother is not able to work due to her ill-health. My elder sister works and runs the family.

I want to become a nurse!

My mother decided to marry me to a wealthy 40 year old man. I wanted to continue my studies. But, my mother was firm in her decision.

I shared this with our Children Support Group and they informed SSH who intervened and persuaded my mother to stop the marriage. My mother told SSH that she did not have the money to spend on my studies. SSH offered to sponsor my studies.

They raised funds from local donors, school staff too. I plan to join the nursing institute and am happy that I am not married at this young age. This was possible only because of SSH. I will complete the nursing course and will help SSH to further support more girls from my village.

SSH helps the community stem the rate of infection, build awareness and understand prevention measures. We provide food and nutrition, medical assistance, psycho social support, protection and social acceptance to People Living with HIV/ AIDS (PLHAs), especially women. SSH offers yoga and meditation classes to overcome stress and pain. We have identified more than 500 people living with HIV/AIDS in five unions of Dindigul District.

Under-nutrition is responsible for over one-third of all child deaths worldwide. Children who are malnourished are physically stunted with poor brain development and learning difficulties. SSH strives to support the affected and infected children with nutritious food and yoga to have a healthy life.

Building skills is the answer

The income women generate from their operations may be small, but it plays a significant role in meeting family's needs. We offer support to income generation activities like selling flowers and vegetables; poultry and goat rearing. We also offer training in nutrition food preparation and child care. For example, child care training has resulted in 15 percent teachers, Panchayat president and from SSH decrease in mortality death and 100 percent increase in attendance in school.

Laying a strong foundation for children

Life skill education, leadership, yoga meditation, and vocational training (tailoring and computer education) to children have brought in positive approach in their mind and a new look towards life. Through this program we have created clubs for children to motivate them.

- Improvement in health of 87 Children Living With HIV/AIDS
- All children are regular to school and there are no dropouts
- Two rank holders in 10th standard

Children Affected with HIV/AIDS Health and Happiness to All (CHAHA)

Reshaping children's future

We concentrate on children infected and affected with HIV/AIDS through this program CHAHA. It is implemented in four blocks of Dindigul, Oddanchatram, Shanarpatti and Natham that have high prevalence of HIV/AIDS. In total we have 789 children who are born to HIV/AIDS parents. Among them we have 87 children who are living with HIV infection and girls being highest.

We provide education, counseling services to ensure child growth and income generation support to their parents. Through this support, children live in confidence and happiness with their parents or extended families.

1 Earn Rs. 150 a day!

I am Mariyammal, aged 32 living at Sengurichi, Dindigul District. I have two daughters. My husband was a daily coolie worker and earned only Rs. 70/- daily. He was infected with HIV/AIDS. He borrowed money at high interest to run the family and for his treatment. He lost his life three years back. Thereafter, I was ill-treated by my in-laws and forced to leave my home denying the share of property. News of my husband's death spread in the village and I was rejected by the community. I built a small but outside the village and lived with my two daughters. I worked as a coolie to separate seeds from tamarind at Rs 30 per day for every 10 kgs. My elder daughter too was compelled to work.

SSH identified us and provided counseling, income generation support and education to my daughters. After the training, I started my own tamarind seed separating business. I earn Rs 150 daily enough to run my house and educate my daughters.

And now my two daughters go to school regularly and my second daughter gets 1st rank in class. I am able to repay the debts. Now my family lives with dignity and happiness.

Comprehensive Care and Support for Women and Children

From relief to lasting solutions

- 16 members sell sanitary napkins in their villages.
- 100 packets are sold every month bringing regular income.



People with HIV/AIDS have higher rates of mental health problems than those seen in the general population.

We support 200 women and 200 children of HIV infected and affected in three unions of Dindigul District. We provide training in nutritional food preparation, art, skill building (sanitary napkin preparation), self-care, home care and herbal medicines.

Children get training in life skills (emotional, creative thinking, decision making and stress management), leadership, yoga, tailoring and computer.

SSH organized sanitary napkin training to 20 women living with HIV/AIDS. Staff from the resource organization taught the process of preparing sanitary napkins at lower cost indicating the importance of using napkins, marketing techniques and income earning procedures.

Thereafter, we organized a health camp at Sithur village, which has 150 adolescent girls. We explained the importance of personal hygiene, changes in adolescent growth and the use of sanitary napkins. A school heard about this and invited SSH staff members to organize an awareness camp for 200 girls and 100 boys.

Adolescent Health Education Program Safe Drinking Water Educating the youth to lead a healthy life

This program focuses on physical and mental growth of the adolescent. We stress upon menstrual hygiene, sexual behaviour and provide awareness on self-protection from Sexually Transmitted Disease and HIV.

SSH strengthens the communication gap between adolescents and parents. We give training to adolescent groups, parents and self-help group members on balanced diet, health and hygiene, physical and psychological changes during the adolescent period, female and male reproductive systems and contraceptive methods.

Community Based Care and Support Program Providing comfort to HIV/AIDS affected community

We work with the community to reduce parent to child transmission in three blocks of Dindigul District. Only 60 per cent of the women go for periodical checkup while none of their spouses underwent tests. But after our intervention, they go for tests and only 2 percent of children are born with HIV/AIDS.

SSH concentrates on women who are under Anti Natal Care (ANC) and organizes training programs to create awareness on HIV/AIDS, prevention of mother to child transmission, regular medication and proper child care.

Good water, good protection

The absence of safe water and sanitation has led to the contraction of deadly diseases. Every year almost two million people die of water borne diseases like diarrhoea and cholera.

Providing safe, clean water near people's homes and villages prevent water borne diseases and is a time-saving factor for women and children who walk long distances to fetch water.

In India less than 20 percent of the population have access to safe drinking water. People face health hazards due to untreated or unsafe water. SSH had initiated safe drinking water program in 30 villages of Sempatti and Namakkal regions. These villages have access to safe water and there is evidence to the reduction of water borne diseases.

We provided income generation support to 470 women PLHAs. Our support gave them hope to lead a positive life, concentrate on their children's education, manage the household and become economically stable.

I am happy!

Murugeshwari, aged 27, a PLHA lives with her seven year old son, Premkumar. Her husband abandoned her few years back. She found it tough to make both ends meet. Her son too is infected.

She heard about SSH and we initially helped her son to continue his education, gave nutritional food and other basic needs.

We gave her income generation support for milch animal rearing and helped her to avail tailoring machine from Govt. Welfare Scheme.

She was also trained to prepare a certain type of disinfectant at Gandigram Rural Institute, which she sells locally. Now with three small income generation activities, she gets regular income. She is able to send her son to school, provide nutritional food and manage the household well.

Murugeshwari says "I am happy and able to live with dignity. Thanks to SSH for making a way for me."



Integrated Women Development Program

She must have a 'Voice'

Living in a male dominant society the women are secluded into four walls, restricted to take decisions and depend upon men. Through the concept of self-help groups and women federation, SSH encourages the women to be powerful leaders. We encourage the women to be part of self-help groups (SHGs) and integrated all the SHGs into a women federation called Bharathi Women Federation. We have 2800 women members including 475 PLHAs.

At the Bharathi Women Federation, village women are trained to be independent individuals, taking decisions on their own to face any challenge. The federation holds regular meeting to solve problems faced by these women. The federation has two branches - Cluster level and Union level federation. Issues unsolved are brought to Cluster level federation and if unsolved here too, it is taken up to the Union level federation. They also participate in mass campaigns, advocacy and review their performance periodically.



Alternative Learning Centres Because you're special!

SSH established 15 alternative learning centres, with 15 efficient teachers who help the children to grow holistic with integrity. 450 children are being benefited. This centre functions three hours daily wherein they study, read, play and are taught about personal hygiene, personality development, social responsibility, environment protection etc.

Apart from this, we organize many competitions like drawing, essay writing, speech, singing, dancing sports etc. during special days. This motivates the children and creates an environment for them to improve their skills.



- 15 children scored above 400 marks in 10th grade
- Five children stood as school rank holders
- -Gave awareness on the importance of education to 1200 villages




Local Resource Mobilisation Staff raising local resources for SSH!
